



- There were 1,190 responses representing 1,852 students.

Question #2 By law, face coverings are required on buses and vans; will your child(ren) be using District transportation to and from school?




59.5% Yes, my child(ren) will ride the District bus/van and wear an appropriate face covering.

48.8% No


24.4% I am undecided

20.9% Yes


5.9% of respondents replied with situation-specific answers such as:


50.4% I believe quarantining should be optional (parents are notified, but not required to quarantine).

34.4% I believe quarantining students and staff is essential to keeping schools open.

10.5% I believe quarantining is not/will not be an effective mitigation strategy.

 - My kids are vaccinated, so I'm not worried.
 - It depends on the situation
 - Let the staff decide

- families recognize and appreciate the efforts the District made to mitigate the spread of COVID-19 last year
